### Sheringham Carnival, 1<sup>st</sup> August, 2007, Exercise Carnival Watch

COURSE: Station Road Car park junction of Station Road and Cromer Road, proceed East along Cromer Road, turn left into Beeston Road, then left into Wyndham Street, then left into High Street, then left fork (at clock tower) up Station Road to Car Park from whence started.

START TIME: RAYNET controller to be on station by 5.00 pm to meet organisers. RAYNET operators to be on station by 5.00pm.

Positions...Use 144.650MHz

1. Terry, G7RNN, will be on the Station Road Car Park, acting as Controller for the event.

2. Ian, 2EØILH, will head the procession, to keep Terry informed as to the progress of the procession, and react to any requests from organisers.

3. Graham, M1CQS, will be mobile in the centre of the procession.

4. Alan, GØTAM, will be at junction of Wyndham Street and Beach Road.

5. David, MØCNP, will be sweeper, AND WILL STAND DOWN STATIONS (Alan!) AS HE PASSES.

This is a communications exercise, and is NOT connected with providing comms for St John's Ambulance as has happened in the past. Naturally, in the event of an incident or accident, we would provide comms if requested should their own system not cope.

PARKING: Please wear RAYNET TABARDS AND IDENTITY BADGES, and if you place your RAYNET VEHICLE STICKER in your windscreen, you may park on the Station Car Park.

Exercise Carnival Watch is a training comms exercise authorised by EPO, North Norfolk District Council, Cromer.

The event went very well, and passed without incident.
